




Thank you for completing the adapted Trauma Systems Readiness Tool, an assessment originally developed by the Chadwick Trauma-Informed Systems Project (CTISP) as part of the National Child Traumatic Stress Network.

This assessment was designed for child serving organizations to assess their trauma-informed approaches within their own system. **Domain 1: Child Welfare Agency's Understanding of the Impact of Child Traumatic Stress on Children Being Served**

Your organization scored 5 out of 6 for Domain 1. This domain assessed your training and educational practices around the prevalence of trauma, trauma symptoms, cultural differences, triggers that impact a child's behavior, screening and referral practices, and knowledge and availability of about trauma-focuses treatments.

**Domain 2: Trauma and the Child Welfare System**

Your organization scored 5.5 out of 6 for Domain 2. This domain assessed the agency's understanding of how child welfare activities can impact trauma on children, the agency's role to reduce the impact of trauma, teamwork, psychological safety, and providing resources to caregivers when needed.

**Domain 3: Vicarious Trauma (aka Secondary Traumatic Stress) in Professionals Working in Child Welfare System**

Your organization scored 5.5 out of 6 for Domain 3. This domain assessed the agency's efforts to recognize and address vicarious trauma within employees, training employees how to address their own trauma, and prioritizing staff development.

**Domain 4: Systems Integration/Service Coordination with Other Child-Serving Agencies**

Your organization scored 5.6 out of 6 for Domain 4. This domain assessed the agency's teamwork and cross-collaboration efforts, such as working with other service providers, cross-training, and working with other agencies.
